Aperitif

Freixenet Cordon Negro Brut, Penedes, Catalonia, Spain Wine Advocate, rated 90

"A tete de cuvee that's aged on the lees for 24 months. Yellow in color, with small active bubbles. Pears, green apples and pineapples on the nose. Grapefruit and honey dew flavors, with a long yeasty, toasty, dry, citrusy finish." - Review from Wine Enthusiast

Appetizer Wines

Beringer 2004 Private Reserve Chardonnay, Napa Valley, California Wine Advocate #162, rated 92

"...this chardonnay is a mixture of the most expressive lots and blended to create an intensely aromatic and flavorful wine featuring citrus, tropical notes of fresh pineapple and mango, crème brulee, brown spice and butterscotch that come together for a seamlessly long, plush finish."

Kenwood 2004 Sauvignon Blanc, Sonoma County, California Wine Spectator 7/31/2005, rated 91 Wine Enthusiast, rated 90

"Run, don't walk, to buy this by the case. It's California Sauvignon Blanc at its best, long and deep in gooseberry and alfalfa flavors, but complexed with richer notes of lime and peach custard and vanilla pudding. But it's not a sweetie. It's dry and crisp in acids."

Entrée Wines

Rosenblum 2003 Annette's Reserve Zinfandel, Mendocino, California Won at the prestigious Zion Oenophiles Organization Zinfandel Tasting, February, 2006 Wine Spectator, rated 92

"Dark, ripe, plush and concentrated, a rustic style with layers of plum, wild berry and black cherry that pick up a nice mint and spice edge along with a dash of hazelnut from oak, finishing with dry, firm tannins. Drink now through 2009. 2,000 cases made"

Swanson Vineyards 2002 Merlot, Rutherford, CA Wine Enthusiast 11/1/2005, rated 91

"I like this Merlot a lot. It's in-your-face with potent cherry, chocolate and violet notes, as well as plenty of oak, and backed up with firm, chewy tannins. It has subtle nuances that keep you coming back for more."

Dessert Wine

Peter Lehman 2002 Cabernet Sauvignon, Barossa, Southeastern Australia Wine Spectator 11/30/2004, rated 90

"Lithe in texture, not a huge wine but beautifully focused, aglow with blueberry, currant and subtle bay leaf and spice flavors that persist with refinement through a long, harmonious finish. Drink now through 2010. 20,000 cases made."
